Subject: Discuss succession planning for the Police Department

BACKGROUND

Chief Laura Eastman is planning a retirement date of September 15, 2023. Prior to that date, she intends to use some accrued paid leave, during which time she is recommending that Sergeant Jay Jackson serve as the interim Police Chief for day-to-day operations, per the labor union agreement. Chief Eastman will remain accessible for calls and to provide guidance to Sergeant Jackson on an asneeded basis during the paid leave.

If the City Council is receptive to Sergeant Jackson serving in the interim capacity and perhaps considering him as a permanent replacement for the Police Chief position, staff is recommending the City Council discuss this in further detail at the June 5 workshop. In preparation for the workshop, staff recommends the City Council submit questions/comments/concerns to Assistant City Administrator Taylor, which would then be the basis for discussion with Sergeant Jackson to gauge his level of interest, learn more about his experience and qualifications, and determine whether he would be a good fit for the position. It is anticipated that the initial interim period would last 2-3 months, at which time the City Council would then evaluate and discuss Sergeant Jackson's performance in the position for consideration of a permanent appointment.

Chief Eastman has expressed the utmost confidence in Sergeant Jackson's capability of serving in the interim capacity, as well as becoming her permanent successor. However, if the consensus of the City Council is to consider an alternative interim scenario other than what is outlined above, or conducting an open executive search for the position, staff recommends that be determined at the May 1 workshop, so staff can prepare accordingly.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the City Council provide direction on a succession plan for the Police Department as a result in Chief Laura Eastman's pending retirement.
